CAMPAIGN for CHILDREN HUMAN TRAFFICKING



Shelbi Ball is the Grants and Partnerships Specialist for AncoraTN, formerly known as End Slavery Tennessee. She will be our speaker for Campaign for Children, which will be held at the Riverside United Methodist Church, 313 6^{TH} Ave. in Columbia on Sunday, April 23 at 3 pm.

End Slavery Tennessee was founded and named to sound the alarm that human trafficking exists and is happening in our very own backyard. In the past decade, they've grown from raising awareness to providing survivors a place of healing and restoration. Although anyone can be impacted by human trafficking, people of color, immigrants, and people who identify as LGBTQIA+ are disproportionally exploited. People affected by economic disparity, mental illness, housing insecurity, systemic oppression, along with runaway youth and children in foster care, often fall victim to human trafficking.

AncoraTN manages all human trafficking referrals in the Middle Tennessee region as a member of the Tennessee Counter-Trafficking Alliance (TCTA), formerly known as Tennessee Anti-Slavery Alliance. TCTA ensures quality consistent human trafficking focused services will be provided statewide in the most effective and efficient way possible. TCTA advocates for systemic change and provides comprehensive trauma-informed aftercare to survivors of human trafficking anywhere in Tennessee.

Shelbi Ball will share information; along with ways we can support and be involved with AncoraTN.

From the District Treasurer

Hi there!

This is my brief annual summary of how the Harpeth River District fared financially in 2022.

I am excited to say that we exceeded our Pledge for Missions to the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference! Our pledge for 2022 was \$18,000. With your financial giving, we actually sent them **\$26,352.32**.

In addition, I have very good news to share with you. In 2022, we started using a new report in the TWK Conference for units to let us know how much they have sent to organizations or places they support outside of UWF. In addition to the total \$26,352.32 sent through our district to the conference and national office, the units have sent a total of **\$42,281.45** to local schools, shelters, food pantries, college students, Christmas boxes for children, Christmas gifts for nursing homes, the jail ministry, as well as Miriam's Promise, Henderson Settlement, Guatemala and more. It is amazing to see all the places touched by the women in our district.

I know that 2023 will bring its own challenges. It is important for us to remember why we work together and give our financial support through UWF. In doing this, we are giving to women, children and youth, who need our help to survive and learn of God's goodness.
