She presented a powerful presentation about their work with human trafficking in the 41 counties in Middle Tennessee and in conjunction with other groups throughout our state.



Ancora provides comprehensive aftercare services for human trafficking. Human trafficking is defined as the exploitation of humans for purposes such as sexual and labor servitude where something of value is exchanged (money, food, housing, drugs, etc.) through the means of force, fraud or coercion. Unfortunately, the perpetrator could be your neighbor, a teacher or a "nice" stranger.
